


Alex Weinstein | The Case for Beauty September 10 – October 29, 2022



The case for beauty is the title of a new exhibition but also a through line to a body of work I have been developing slowly for many years. Sculptures and paintings in the exhibition revisit themes and perspectives I am familiar with - all based on the places I visit often and the landscapes that speak to me. In this new work, I have tried to emphasize the abundant temporal and transcendent glory that is all around us. The cumulative weight, sadness and anxiety of recent politics here and abroad, coupled with the tragedy of the Covid-19 pandemic has cut us all; remapping our world in geographic and psychic ways, perhaps irrevocably. And yet! And yet, all around us are signs of life springing forward, or continuing on, altered in ways both bitter and sweet. I've made paintings before that took their chromatic cues and compositional strategies from the always encroaching urban framing of our world and so I am not suggesting that we cast a blind eye to the dark side of things, to an "easier" view. Perhaps there is no easy view: rather, I'd like to offer, that things can be two things (or more) at once; that the evening sky over LAX and its fluorescent spectacle owes some of its power to the jet fuel circulating through it, but it's gorgeous, nonetheless. This work of mine is to celebrate the beauty I'm seeing everywhere and champion an optimism I believe remains easily within reach to us all.


The Big Drawing, Neptune's Net, 2022, oil on canvas, 85  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 108 inches


